<p><b>Scripture: Luke 24 v 17</b>          (The story is of two disciples who were walking home from Jerusalem to the village of Emmaus just after Jesus death)  <b>What are you discussing together as you walk along?</b>  <b>They stood still their faces downcast</b></p> 	<p><b>Comment:</b> Jesus was interested in their conversation. He knew them. He realised that they were confused and sad and traumatised by his death.          He took the initiative and they didn't recognise him at first. As couples we often talk through the events of the day – Jesus may be closer than we think, wanting to be part of our conversation. Realising this and acting on it could be the start of a different sort of prayer as a couple?  <b>What are you discussing together as you walk along?</b></p>
<p><b>Prayer (as a couple):</b>          Lord Jesus, we think we may be missing out on your company by not recognising you when you are walking along with us. Please show us how to recognise you and share our walk and talk with you.          Amen</p>	<p><b>Prayer (for others): think for a moment about your circle- who needs to discover Jesus walking along with them?</b>          Lord Jesus, we remember A.... and B....          They really don't see you – perhaps they are not even looking. Please take the initiative and show yourself to them. Help them understand. Help them with their lives Amen</p>
